About the Society

Formed as the Nunawading Historical Society in 1965, early initiatives included the collection and display of historical items following the restoration of Schwerkolt Cottage and the development of the Museum Complex.

Mission Statement: “The Whitehorse Historical Society at the Schwerkolt Cottage and Museum Complex seeks to share the stories of the people, places and events that tell the history of the Whitehorse area to the present day by collecting, researching and exhibiting the objects, photographs and documents in our care.”

Acknowledgement of Country: “In the spirit of reconciliation, Whitehorse Historical Society Inc. acknowledges the Wurundjeri people as the traditional custodians of the land on which Whitehorse stands. We pay our respects to their Elders past and present and emerging”.

Its scope is the suburbs of Blackburn, Blackburn North, Blackburn South, Burwood East, Forest Hill, Mitcham, Nunawading, Vermont and Vermont South.

Collections include items relating to domestic life, education, local families and identities, religious, recreational, social and working life and local business, industry and agriculture.

The Local History Collection includes books, maps, periodicals and newspapers, oral and written histories, photos, slides, audio and video tapes and ephemera, available for research by the public on Wednesdays 10am to 3pm or by appointment. Schwerkolt Cottage & Museum Complex

The Complex is located on part of the land acquired in 1861 by the German pioneer immigrant family of August Schwerkolt. It includes:

- a three-roomed stone cottage built of local materials completed in 1888, which has been restored and furnished in the style of the period
- an original wine cellar which has also been restored and contains wine-making equipment of the period
- reconstructed outbuildings include a barn and blacksmith's shop, and a replica of a smokehouse used by the Schwerkolt family
- a Museum and Visitors' Centre that contains textiles and costumes, photographs, domestic implements, heritage craft items, hand tools and other implements. An orcharding shed houses a collection of agricultural machinery which includes many items used in local orchards
- the Local History Room, which is the meeting room of the Society, and houses its collection of documents, photographs and artifacts.

The Complex is fully accredited by Museums Australia as complying with their criteria for good museum practice.

- If you know of any business records, diaries, letters, photographs or artifacts that people may be willing to donate to the collection, please let us know. These may be of great interest to researchers or visitors to the Cottage and Museum.
